

MIGRATION IN THE AMERICAS

The region hosts around 26.6 per cent of the world's migrants - 61.6 million people. Migrants and internally displaced persons who try to re-establish themselves in other places are often subjected to discrimination, violence and lack of access to social and health services. Migration represents a growing challenge that affects

the continuity of healthcare and the management, treatment and prevention of communicable diseases. Migrants and internally displaced populations have significant impact on their communities of origin, transit and destination.

INCLUSION AND INNOVATION IN ACTION: CUERDA FIRME PROGRAM

Cuerda Firme is a training program for the development of social-emotional skills through the performing arts, such as circus theater and music. It is aimed at young people between 18 and 29 years of any nationality. Currently, 120 young Peruvians and Venezuelans participate as part of the program.

What is this program looking for?

- Strengthen social-emotional skills.
- · Create and enhance support groups.
- · To favour a safe space for cultural and social exchange.
- Train possible agents of change to replicate what they have learned in their community support groups.

Who implements this program?

Cuerda Firme is implemented by La Tarumba and the Peruvian Red Cross, with the support of the IFRC, the United Nations Refugee Agency - UNHCR, and the European Union.
